

COME AND PLAY

A game for children from 3 to 6 years of age.

Contents: Game board

16 figures in 4 colours

1 dice

Instructions

Come and play is a game for very small children who cannot count yet. Instead of a dice with dots (numbers 1 – 6) a dice with pictures is used. The game board has the same pictures on. So you advance round the board by the picture shown on the dice. The main picture is a flower. If the flower falls you throw the dice again and you have to throw the flower to start the game (i. e. put a figure on the starting space).

Before the game players get 4 figures of a colour each and place them on basic spaces identical with the colour of their figures. Then the game begins. Children take turns to throw the dice. The one who throws the flower places a figure onto the starting space (the flower space of the same colour as the figure) and throws the dice again. The player advances onto the first picture identical with the one thrown on the dice. On every next flower throw a player can either put another figure into the game or advance with a figure in the game onto the flower space and then throw the dice again and advance by one more picture, which has been thrown on the second throw. If a player has a figure in the game, on each throw he/she advances onto the space with the same picture as thrown on the dice. If a player is to advance onto the space that has already been occupied by an opponent's figure, the player then can throw that figure out. The affected player has to start with that figure again. The first one to manage to go all the way round the circle with all his/her figures and to place them onto the target spaces of his/her colour is the winner.

It is not always amusing for little children to throw figures out. Therefore it is possible to play without throwing figures out and this is how to make the game more exciting: If a picture of an already occupied space falls on the dice, a player advances by one more space. If a heart falls, a player misses a turn.

Have a nice time playing the game.

Warning: The set contains tiny pieces so the game is not suitable for children under the age of three, as they might swallow them.
